With the successful conclusion of 2015, Michigan Community Credit Union reached our 80th year of serving as our members' financial partner. We are very proud to be Jackson's oldest credit union, so we will be celebrating our 80th birthday throughout 2016.

When we began in 1936, we were established to serve a single group: the teachers in Jackson County. Since then, we have evolved to serve anyone who lives, works, worships or attends school in 16 counties in Southern Michigan.

Today, we have four branch locations and offer a full range of products, including Mortgages, Business Lending, Credit and Debit Cards with Rewards, Indirect Lending, Term Share Accounts, Money Market Accounts, Checking Accounts, Business Accounts, Online Banking, Bill Pay and Mobile Banking.

Chairman's Report

Michigan Community Credit Union is 80 years old and thriving!

Thirty years ago, I was privileged to attend a dinner to honor former Board members at our 50th anniversary, when we were known as Educators and Employees Credit Union. It was very interesting to hear them describe the "early days," when the Board Chair and Directors would walk the halls of Jackson High School and collect money in a shoe box so that someone could buy a car! Receipts were written on a 3x5 index card, and the interest rate paid on deposits, as well as loan rates, were better than at other financial institutions. In many cases, the member did not even qualify for a loan from a standard financial institution. The joke was that if you qualified for a loan, you didn't need one!

Today, we are a community credit union with \$146 million in assets, and we serve our members through multiple platforms, including electronic and mobile. You can deposit a check, transfer money, apply for a loan and pay your bills from your smartphone! Our commitment to technology has provided us with efficiencies of operation comparable to much larger financial institutions. This year, we were able to grow our assets by 11.5%!

Of course, you can visit one of our four branches and work with our professional staff to assist you with all of your financial transactions. While you are there, check out the new artwork celebrating our community.

Thanks to our very committed staff and Board of Directors for their dedication and service, and thanks to our long-term and new members, our owners, for choosing Michigan Community Credit Union. Our longevity and success would not be possible without your commitment! We look forward to serving you and our community in the years to come!

Financial Education

Crazy Bowl for Junior Achievement

Junior Achievement (JA) partners with local businesses like Michigan Community Credit Union to deliver real-world educational programs on work-readiness, entrepreneurship and financial literacy skills to students in our community. To support their efforts, the credit union sponsored and participated in a Crazy Bowl fundraising event, featuring a fun day of bowling, raffles, prizes and more.

Member Seminars and School Presentations

To help increase the financial literacy of our members and students in our community, Michigan Community Credit Union hosted member seminars on eServices and Identity Theft, as well as school presentations on the basics of financial literacy. We also partner with local schools to provide In-School Credit Union programs, where students can learn how a credit union operates and additional money management skills.

We look forward to hosting even more seminars in 2016!



College Scholarships

Michigan Community Credit Union awarded five area graduating seniors with scholarships of \$1,000 each to a college or university of their choice. Winners were selected based on their excellence in academics and outstanding community service record. This year's recipients were Hadleigh Buchler of Northwest High School; Maggie Belcher of Springport High School; James Darby and Jennifer Holubowicz, both of Michigan Center High School; and Zachary Schossau, homeschooled.

Forward Thinking Grants

Every quarter, Michigan Community Credit Union awards up to \$1,500 to local organizations and classrooms to support educational projects and ideas. We receive dozens of applications every year for projects designed to enrich the educational lives of students or participants. Some of the projects that received grants this year included:

- Hillsdale County ISD Great Start Dolly Parton Imagination Library Project, a free book distribution program for children up to five years of age.
- Townsend Elementary Music Program Upgraded 30 computers with Music Ace, a music software program that provides a fun and comprehensive introduction to music fundamentals.
- Jackson Storyfest Annual free cultural and educational storytelling event that promotes literacy, listening skills and a greater cross-cultural understanding.


